Dissemination & Knowledge Translation

ICI disseminates information through over 300 print and digital resources developed by its projects and centers, including videos, publications, webinars, web sites, online curricula, books, and journal articles. It translates research findings into resources tailored to specific audiences, including people with intellectual and developmental disabilities, through the use of descriptive infographics and online interviews with our researchers.

Research

ICI conducts applied research in many broad topical areas to discover knowledge and develop new practices that can support the well-being, self-determination, and community inclusion of people with disabilities across the lifespan.

In the past year, ICI staff published and presented their research at more than 40 state, regional, national, and international conferences, as well as through over 20 publications in scholarly books and journals.
